

SPECIAL HELP IN THE HOME

Alarm Systems

This system alleviates the serious problem of elderly people who get into difficulties n their homes and are unable to attract ttention and get help. If you are an elderperson living alone your home can be itted with this system.

Free Telephones

The local authority wil install a telephone n your home and pay the rental costs in accordance with the following conditions. In order to apply for this service you need medical recommendation (ie. from your doctor). Also you need to meet some or all of the following conditions:

you need to be able to contact a doctor

you are in danger when left alone unless provided with a telephone

you live alone or if not are frequently left alone at home you are unable in normal weather to leave home without help from another.

you think you may qualify for this

service, but are not sure, apply anyway.

f you are an elderly person or a disabled person living alone, you are eligible to apply for a home help. There is a maximum charge of 35p per hour but you may qualify for this service at a reduced rate or free of charge depending on your needs and income.

Home Bathing

If you live alone and are unable to bath yourself without help, a home bathing service is operated by district nurses.
