BEER

ABOUT 75% of Britain's pubs sell beers produced by one of six large brewing combines - Allied Breweries, Bass Charrington, Courage, Scottish & Newcastle, Watneys and Whitbread

Of these, Allied have the largest share of Merseyside pubs - trading under their Tetley constituent and a good proportion of their houses sell natural, unpressurised Tetley bitter and mild, and still to be found in a dwindling number of pubs is the old Walker's bitter.

Bass Charrington have a large number of houses in our area and natural beer is quite widespread, including Burton Bass, Brew Ten, Worthington BB, 4X Mild and M&B mild.

Whitbread, "the pint that thinks it's called beer" have now completely ceased to supply naturally conditioned beer to any of their Merseyside outlets (indeed over the whole of north-west England).

Courage usually use their John Smith disguise and likewise supply no reai ale to Merseyside.

Watneys, to the best of my knowledge do not supply the real stuff in this area, though the excellent beers oduced by their Wilson's brewery are available further towards Man-

The discerning drinker of S & N's products must travel to Wigan or Raby Mere to sample Younger's IPA, meanwhile the revolting Tartan continues to make it worthwhile hurrying past all pubs selling it.

Beers produced by a fair number of independents can be found in our area. Greenall Whitley are spread well through the county and a lot of their pubs sell genuine bitter and dark mild (light mild can be found if you look hard enough) mostly through electric slider pumps.

The only brewery still active within Liverpool is Higsons whose distinctively flavoured bitter and mild are deservedly popular. Higson's A REMINDER that all pubs should is the strongest local bitter (1038.8 now be displaying easily seen price original gravity) and also the cheap-

est - an increasingly important factor in these inflationary times. At least half Higson's 170 pubs sell real beer, largely via handpumps.

Thwaites of Blackburn and Burtonwood of Newton-le-Willows have a few outlets on Merseyside - they are worth seeking out and both produce highly palatable bitters and milds, mostly without pressure.

Boddingston's of Salford, with 280 pubs - all selling natural, nongassed beer are available on the fringe of Merseyside around St Helens and Skelmersdale.
